#### WebEOC Training

#### IC-718 MARS Mod

When you see the Icom IC-718 missing in the MERT EOC room, don't panic..... it's been sent it in for a "MARS modification". This upgrade makes the radio compatible for use for SHARES communications and also provides MERT a backup transceiver to the IC-7100 which was modified in June.

#### More on SHARES

MERT applied and was recently granted <u>SHARES</u> <u>approval</u> by the Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (Dept. of Homeland Security - DHS). The SHAred RESources (SHARES) High Frequency (HF) Radio program



provides an additional means for organizations with a national security and emergency preparedness mission to communicate when landline, cellular and Internet communications are unavailable. SHARES members use HF radio resources to coordinate and transmit messages needed to perform critical functions, including those areas related to leadership, safety, maintenance of law and order, emergency management, finance, and public health.

**One important note to remember**... The SHARES program is administered by DHS and uses frequencies outside of those available for amateur use by the Federal Communications Commission. From past experiences, this may be critical during emergency operations as HF frequencies allocated to amateur radio use can become congested and unavailable for critical messages between Emergency Management

organizations. Just as MERT is a critical resource "when all else fails" for the Division of Emergency Management.... SHARES access provides MERT another option.... when airwaves may be overloaded... to get critical information to regional, state and national agencies.

MERT will be using SHARES as part of the Florida Region 3 & 5 Monthly NET. Shares training is planned in the future as we become more familiar with the procedures, regular training NET's and our growing experience with its operation.

[Note: It is vitally important that all MERT Members learn and participate in the monthly Region 3 & 5 training NET to become familiar with the specific tests and actions required in supporting an emergency activation. Every MERT Member must be knowledgeable of the systems and processes to be prepared in fulfilling our Mission...

If you are not familiar with this NET, please plan on participating to become fully capable to perform all actions supporting our duties at the EOC.]
