Ok, here's some of our upcoming projects:

- ✓ Finalizing a new and slimmed down version ICS-205 focusing on making it easier and simpler to use.
- ✓ Reprogramming all the SHREK Kit radios (along with a couple of the Radio room radios) so all will be the programmed the same.
- ✓ Finishing the testing of the radio facilities on the Mobile Command Center (MCC).
- ✓ Start building an MCC Operations Manual to guide all Members in setting up, operating and supporting MERT activities while operating the MCC during deployments.
- ✓ Complete the school Shelter Audits.
- ✓ See the antenna repairs at Belleview Middle School are completed ASAP.
- ✓ Organize a joint Marion County Exercise for EMCOMM teams (MERT, ARES and HEC).
- ✓ Replacing and moving the OCF HF Antenna tower (telescoping type) to the outer corner of the generator fence to place the antenna long wire element further from the large tree.
- ✓ Join the weekly WINLINK digital communications tests by MERT Members
- ✓ Join other MERT Members and get involved in the FDEM Region 3/5 monthly Exercise on August 30th to learn how to conduct the many aspects it requires.



July 20th - MCC Testing Update

Testing report to Director Preston Bowlin, MCSO.



MERT conducted extensive system acceptance testing of the new MCC on July 20th in testing our radio/antenna systems. Harlan Cook, MERT Coordinator and Leon Jurcyszyn, Technical Advisor conducted the tests and submitted a report to document the results.

July 26th Meeting – (10 members)

- ✓ The MCC is now fully functional except the HF Tarheel antenna which won't "tune" even with +12 volts available. The VHF/UHF is fully functional with SWR of 1.5.
- ✓ MERT recommends replacing the Tarheel antenna by the manufacturer and then check the connections.
- ✓ MERT will be documenting all the connections and cable jumpers inside and outside the MCC. This will be in an Operations Manual used as a reference/training guide and stored in the MCC for use by any MERT Member supporting the MCC in a deployment.



- ✓ Trainings for MERT personnel on how to man the MCC will be coming soon.
- ✓ The MCC will be getting a front, vertical awning to shade on the outside MERT station protecting Members from sun and inclement weather.
- ✓ The new MCC radios are going to be stored in the EOC and made available for all types of uses from the MCC to Field Deployments for any MCSO activation.
- ✓ KK4AEG is the MERT call sign while the MCC is deployed. KG4NXO is still the callsign for MERT EOC operations.
- ✓ Harlan shared that he spoke to CERT membership at Stone Creek to make them aware of MERT and how to call a report in.
- ✓ Hayden stated that ARRL has recognized ARES who can be embedded into CERT community teams. He also stated that we are in FEMA Region 4 and FL State Region 5.

I retired from the Air Force in 1983 having served 6 years in the Army and then 17 years in the Air Force. While I was in the Air Force, I started

with CB radio. I met a lot of people the first couple of years. While I was doing CB in Oklahoma, I started doing storm spotting. There are a lot of tornados in Oklahoma.

When I left there, I spent three tours in the Philippines and one in Illinois. After retiring, I got back into CB. I did that until I got a lightning strike. It seems like lightning likes me. It took out my antenna, so I packed up the CB equipment. After my bout with cancer, I thought about taking out the CB equipment. Then I remembered how bad CB was, so I decided to do what I had thought about doing. I got my Ham license.

While I was in Wisconsin, I was teaching motorcycle safety and officiating different sports. I started giving up the officiating a sport at a time and teaching after the cancer. After getting my Ham license I was doing storm spotting, CERT, and doing different events around the area.

When I moved to Ocala, I wanted to do the same here as I did in Wisconsin. I got involved with MERT and the Silver Springs Radio Club. I enjoy Ham radio. It gives me a chance to talk to people around the world. I was really into working with the EOC in Wisconsin. We worked many events in the summer months including storm spotters.



I like giving back to the local area. Uncle Sam looked after me for 23 so this is a way to give back.

MERT Member Update

County Award – 2500 Counties!

You have read or heard about our "radio road trips" putting counties and parks "on the air" as part of the ham radio hobby. One aspect of this hobby in which I have been involved since the early 1980's is trying to make contacts with other operators in all 3,077 counties of the United States.

CQ Magazine, a national ham radio publication, offers an award certificate for all hams that achieve this goal with *confirmed* contacts.

What is a confirmed contact? We are required to have written confirmation for each of the contacts as we work toward that goal.

Written confirmations are usually done by exchanges of postcard type documents (called QSL cards) verifying the radio communication. I have many such cards from all over the world. I also track those from different counties throughout the United States.

Today I received my ribbon and seal to place on my original 500 county award certificate. This ribbon is for achieving the 2,500 confirmed county contact level.

The next level is 3,000 contacts, then completing all 3,077. I am working on getting them all with cards currently in the mail that, when returned, will put me over the 2,600 confirmed county mark.

Hopefully it won't take me another 40 years to achieve that goal!!!! KA2LHO
