MERT Room Cable & Antenna Testing

Members Bill Sobel (K1WLS) and Harlan Cook (KN4VRM) completed an audit of the cables and polyphaser connections along with SWR Analyzer tests this month.

We are pleased to report that most cables and antennas passed with excellent to good SWR readings. However, two feeds had higher than expected SWR levels (the HF feeds). We will be retesting those feeds in confirming correct operation.



Dept. of Emergency Management Exercise

MERT Members support Dept. of Emergency Management Exercise: Several members participated in a recent EOC exercise testing the relocation of the "Citizen Information Line". The exercise involved activating the lines at the EOC, and due to a potential evacuation order, the Operators were forced to relocate to the County Health Department. Once the move was completed, the process was reversed.

The exercise confirmed the phone transfer systems worked correctly so Operators can continue supporting citizens as required during emergency conditions.
