Background

MERT membership requires a unique combination of knowledge and experiences to perform their functions working alongside professionals whenever emergencies are declared by the Marion County Sheriff's Office Division of Emergency Management. The specific requirements are documented in the Standard Operating Guidelines, Section V. Training, Part C. Required Position Training, MERT Member:

- MERT Performance Packet. (New Member Orientation Guide Level 2)
- F.C.C. License.
- ICS 100, 200, 700 and 800 within 1 year of membership (online).

What is ICS 100, 200, 700 and 800?



The National Incident Management System (NIMS) guides all levels of **FEMA** government, nongovernmental organizations and the private sector on how to work together to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to and recover from emergency incidents locally and nationally.

NIMS provides stakeholders across the whole community with the shared vocabulary, systems and processes to successfully deliver the capabilities described in the National Preparedness System. NIMS defines operational systems that guide how personnel work together during incidents.

This starts with all MERT members taking and completing four (4) online classes provided by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). (See "Getting Started" for the detailed steps moving forward.)

ICS-100 Introduction to Incident Command System

This course introduces the Incident Command System (ICS) and provides the foundation for higher level ICS training. The course describes the history, features and principles, and organizational structure of the Incident Command System. It also explains the relationship between ICS and the National Incident Management System (NIMS).



ICS-200 ICS for Single Resource and Initial Action

This course designed to enable personnel to operate efficiently during an incident or event within the Incident Command System (ICS). ICS-200 provides training on and resources for personnel who are likely to assume a supervisory position within the ICS.

ICS-700 A National Incident Management System

This course introduces and overviews the National Incident Management System (NIMS). NIMS provides a consistent nationwide template to enable all government, private-sector, and nongovernmental organizations to work together during domestic incidents.

ICS-800 Nation Response Framework

The course introduces participants to the concepts & principles of the National Response Framework.

Getting Started

To complete these online classes from FEMA, follow these steps.

- 1. <u>Secure a FEMA Student ID number</u> (SID).
 - a. The FEMA Student Identification (SID) number is a unique number generated and assigned to anyone who needs or is required to take training provided by a FEMA organization. Your FEMA SID uniquely identifies you throughout the FEMA organization and all of its agencies. The

Put a copy in your Skill Book and bring it to the next MERT meeting so it can be recorded and filed.
